Tom is very interested in the regulatory side of the sport and has already spent a lot of time shadowing the BHA raceday team on race days.



Meanwhile, another former Jump jockey Ed Glassonbury has also received a scholarship to help fund a Quantity Surveying degree at University College of Estate Management.

THOMAS BROWN

Former John Smith's Cup winning jockey Thomas Brown finished his riding career and was riding out before a meeting with Phil Kinsella at Peter O'Sullevan House changed the direction of his career entirely. He wanted to find something that wasn't office based, where he could meet new people every day and which gave

him a similar adrenalin rush to being a jockey. Together they landed on the idea of the emergency services and after a day shadowing the paramedics at Newmarket racecourse, Thomas applied for a role with the East of England Ambulance Service where he is now working as an Emergency Care Assistant.



Speaking to JETS doesn't mean you've given up on being a jockey or you're not committed, it just means you're progressing yourself as a person.

Splitting his riding between the North of England and the Middle East, Andrew Elliott has been busy building skills to prepare him for the future. After suffering a shoulder injury and speaking with Phil whilst in rehab at Jack Berry House, he discussed his other passion in life for art and drawing.

He subsequently went on to complete a course at the Tattoo Piercing Academy in Manchester, partly funded by JETS and is using his time when not riding out or racing to practise his drawing and tattoo skills so that he can hit the ground running when he does eventually launch his own business as a tattoo artist.

Speaking with Phil made me realise I should set myself a challenge. He asked what I was interested in and said that I could do anything. It's a nice escape from racing to have another focus.

Having something else to think about that runs alongside my current injury rehabilitation has been really beneficial."
