### 1. RODI GREENE

**Age:** 51

**From:** Devon



**Second Career:** BHA Regional Jockey Coach

**Race Riding Career:** Rodi rode for 23 years as a Jump jockey from 1988 to 2011 with over 5000 rides and 350 winners including the Cheltenham Festival's Coral Cup in 2002 aboard Ilnamar and the Sky Bet Chase in 2003 on Barryscourt Lad.

**Career Development:** Rodi suffered a career ending fall and during recovery was approached about coaching jockeys which was still in its infancy at that time. Rodi started coaching in 2012 and has since gained his UKCC Level 3 Jockey Coaching qualification and earlier this year was appointed a full time BHA Regional Coach covering the south of the country. Over the years, Rodi has used all his experience to help nurture jockeys from the pony racing circuit right the way through to winning Championships and currently looks after 25 Flat and Jump jockeys. Rodi has used JETS both during his riding career and beyond, most recently in preparing his application for the Regional Coaching role. He has coached big names such as Tom Marquand, Hollie Doyle and Harry Cobden but his aim is to help every jockey reach their potential, adopting an individual approach for each one, always being accessible and making sure he addresses every aspect of their lives both in and out of the saddle.

**Rodi said:** "I would go as far to say that Jockey coaching has saved me. A job in racing is all I have ever known as it is something I love with a real passion. My own career has been a dream come true and I hope to continue to help as many young jockeys as possible achieve theirs."

**Second Career:** Thoroughbred Nutritionist

**Race Riding Career:** Charlotte rode for 11 years as a Flat jockey with 49 winners including a Group 2 in Bahrain. She was the first female jockey to ride in Dubai, Bahrain, Qatar & Cyprus.

**Career Development:** After Charlotte retired from racing, she was keen to pursue a career in the Stud industry and Equine Nutrition using her Equine Science degree. She first worked as Stud PA and then Stud Manager, using qualifications she gained via JETS to help her. Her role now as Thoroughbred Nutritionist for Spillers Horse Feeds covers all racing yards and studs in the south and south east. She has taken great pride in seeing her advice improve a thoroughbred's life, health and performance. In 2021, she was awarded a merit of 'Outstanding Achievement' award in recognition of all her work and is looking towards becoming a senior Nutritionist and gain a R Nutr (Registered Nutritionist) qualification.

**Charlotte said:** "Being able to still work within the racing industry, which I know so well and love, whilst using my degree and experience is a dream job come true. It is so rewarding helping trainers and studs understand the importance of feeding their horses correctly, and when they do change their feeding regimes the results then speak for themselves, they are blown away at how well their horses look and that very often they go onto win more races."

**Race Riding Career:** Eva rode as an Apprentice jockey for five years from 2011 to 2016, with 160 ride and 12 winners.

**Career Development:** When Eva finished riding, she decided she wanted to set up her own business where she could ultimately control her own success. She'd always been interested in the hospitality sector and felt that Newmarket was missing an independent coffee shop or café which could provide a social hub for the community, especially the racing community. After conducting a lot of research, alongside her riding out, she set up the business three years ago with her partner and used JETS to provide support and advice on what courses she'd need to do. Despite the challenges of the pandemic, the business has gone from strength to strength. She passed the Personal licence course allowing her to expand the offering and serve alcohol at in shop events. She manages a small team of staff, designing the interior as well as all the menus and products and manages the social media and website. She is now hoping to move to a bigger premises and expand the brand to become a boutique chain of espresso bars and bistro cafes.

**Eva said:** "I have worked extremely hard to create somewhere which provides a hub for the locals and visitors to the community and even during COVID, we could still provide good coffee and food and help others through the loneliness of the pandemic. It was difficult to walk away from racing completely and it was daunting setting up my own business but I took a gamble and thankfully it's been a success."
